**Tung Chung New Town Extension – Design and Construction
(Ma Wan Chung Road Works)**

Amendments under section 7

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) (“the Ordinance”), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to amend the works and the use originally shown on Plan No. RD/GZ001 (“the Plan”) and described in the scheme annexed thereto. The Plan and scheme were referred to in G.N. 6852 published under section 8(2) of the Ordinance on 15 September 2017 and 22 September 2017. The proposed amendments are shown on Amendment Plans Nos. RD/GZ001A and RD/GZ001A/LEGEND (“the Amendment Plans”) and described in the amendment scheme annexed thereto. The Amendment Plans and amendment scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature and extent of the proposed amendments are as follows –

- (i) construction of carriageways, footpaths, cycle track, central reserves/traffic islands, pedestrian crossings and slope;
- (ii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing carriageways into footpaths, cycle track and amenity areas;
- (iii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into carriageway, cycle track and amenity area;

- (iv) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing amenity areas into footpath and cycle track;
- (v) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing footpath and amenity area;
- (vi) temporary closure of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, amenity areas and central reserves/traffic islands;
- (vii) deletion of a section of the originally proposed footpath;
- (viii) deletion of the originally proposed pedestrian crossings;
- (ix) deletion of the originally proposed permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing footpath into carriageway;
- (x) deletion of the originally proposed permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing amenity areas into footpath and slope;
- (xi) deletion of the originally proposed temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing carriageways and footpaths; and
- (xii) revision of ancillary works including site formation, landscaping, drainage, sewerage, water, street lighting and utilities works, and installation of street furniture and traffic aids.

The objector should describe his interest and the manner in which he alleges that he will be affected by the proposed amendments in his notice of objection. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the Secretary for Transport and Housing not later than 24th day of July 2018.

Personal Information Collection Statement

Any information, including the personal data, submitted to the Secretary for Transport and Housing in connection with any written objections/comments will be used for the processing of the objections/comments and other related purposes. The provision of any information, including the personal data, other than the information as required under section 10(2) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) is voluntary. However, it may not be possible to process the objections/comments if such information, including the personal data, is not sufficiently provided. Any information, including the personal data, so submitted may be disclosed to the relevant government departments and other persons, organizations or agencies which are required to handle the objections/comments and related matters. Persons who have so submitted their personal data have the rights to request access to and correction of their personal data held by us. Request for access to or correction of the personal data should be made in writing to the Personal Data Privacy Officer of the Transport and Housing Bureau (Transport Branch) at 20th Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong.
